## **Experiencing Punishment in the Community** **Supervisibility of Community Sanctions in Europe**

Despite its dramatic proliferation and diversification in recent decades, offender supervision has been largely invisible in scholarly and public debates about criminal justice. When supervisory sanctions (like Community Payback Orders) are discussed, it is often assumed that they lack punitive 'bite' and, consequently, public credibility.

This event — organised in partnership with Vox Liminis and co-hosted by The Scottish Centre for Crime & Justice Research - challenges these assumptions. It includes an exhibition (curated by the artist Carlyne Kardia) of photographs taken by people subject to offender supervision or by the people who supervise them, a performance (led by Louis Abbott of Scottish indie group Admiral Fallow) of songs stimulated by the pictures and co-written with supervisees, supervisors and others; and a discussion of the underlying research.

After the performance, the SCCJR's Prof Fergus McNeill (University of Glasgow) will convene a panel discussion both about the processes involved in the underlying research and about the issues it raises.
