Sentencing Young People guideline

The Hon. Lord Colbeck
Judicial member of the Scottish Sentencing Council

A graduate of the University of Strathclyde, Lord Colbeck was admitted as a solicitor in 1988, working for A.C. White in Ayr and Levy & McRae in Glasgow before joining MacRoberts in 1993. He became a partner there in 1997, specialising in commercial and construction disputes and health and safety and environmental prosecutions, and served as the managing partner from 2011 to 2014. Following his appointment as a part-time sheriff in 2011 and then a full-time sheriff in 2014, he became the Sheriff Principal of Glasgow and Strathkelvin in 2016. He was subsequently appointed as a judge in the Supreme Courts in May 2023. Lord Colbeck has been a judicial member of the Scottish Sentencing Council since 2020.
